Analysis of the Community Care Comprehensive System Established on Co-production—Ding-caiyuan Development Association as an Example

Abstract

The concept of "co-production" means that both the professional sector and general public should play an equal role in the delivery of services i.e., as well as being knowledge experts and community care givers, they should work together as co-partners. Therefore, we have decided to take the example of the *Long-Term Care Project 2.0* in Chiayi County to discuss how the community organization in Chiayi County interprets "co-production" in care services delivery. We analyzed the construction of the "C Lane Community Station," how the community views "C and A" (the social welfare group established by the local medical institutions) and their mutual relationship with B. Our investigation concluded that it should: pay more attention to specific locality and community characteristics; promote the creation of a common care circle; and continue the community's cultivation of long-term
